



Tourist Preferences at Hotel and Resort Based on Review Data

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Abstract-This study investigates the relationship between cultural dynamics and tourist preferences in hotel and resort settings through comprehensive review data analysis across multiple countries of origin. Using thematic analysis methodology implemented through Atlas.Ti software, the research examines patterns in accommodation preferences, service expectations, and satisfaction determinants. The findings reveal significant variations in guest preferences across different cultural backgrounds, with statistical analysis showing distinctive patterns in visitor demographics. Notably, couples constitute the highest proportion of visitors across multiple destinations, with exceptionally high concentrations in Hong Kong (92%), Malta (90%), and Argentina (62%). Cultural influences manifest through specific preferences in room configurations, dining experiences, and recreational offerings, where Asian tourists emphasize personalized service interactions and traditional elements. At the same time, European visitors prioritize authentic local experiences within luxury accommodation frameworks. The study identifies four key dimensions of managerial adaptation: cultural sensitivity, customization, staff training, and service modifications. These findings contribute to advancing understanding of cultural influences in hospitality contexts while providing practical guidelines for enhancing guest experiences in international hotel operations. The research concludes that effective cultural adaptation strategies enhance guest satisfaction and create sustainable competitive advantages in increasingly globalized hospitality markets.

1. INTRODUCTION

The intricate relationship between cultural dynamics and tourist preferences in hotel and resort settings reveals fascinating patterns based on comprehensive review data analysis across various countries of origin. A significant correlation emerges between cultural background and accommodation expectations, as evidenced by a detailed examination of guest feedback patterns from diverse geographical regions (Apaza-Panca et al., 2024; Dippong & Jillani, 2024; Pulido-Fernández et al., 2024). Cross-cultural analysis indicates that Asian tourists value personalized service interactions and traditional cultural elements incorporated into modern amenities. At the same time, European visitors demonstrate a marked preference for authentic local experiences seamlessly integrated into luxury accommodations. This cultural preference paradigm manifests through specific rating patterns, where guests from collectivist societies consistently emphasize community spaces and group-oriented facilities (Shen et al., 2024; Tuchel et al., 2024). In contrast, those from individualistic cultures prioritize privacy features and personalized experiences. A thorough investigation of review sentiments across different nationality groups demonstrates that cultural nuances significantly influence satisfaction levels, particularly regarding dining options, recreational activities, and service delivery methods. These findings illuminate a critical understanding that successful hotel and resort operations necessitate culturally adaptive management strategies aligned with guest origins, ultimately enhancing satisfaction metrics and establishing competitive advantages in global hospitality markets.

Examining cultural dynamics and tourist preferences in hospitality settings through review data analysis represents an increasingly vital area of study in contemporary tourism research. Understanding these intricate relationships is paramount as global tourism expands, bringing diverse cultural expectations into direct interaction with standardized hospitality practices (Gazi et al., 2024; Kim et al., 2024; Saut & Bie, 2024; Takuatung & Bussracumpakorn, 2024). A sophisticated analysis of review patterns across different nationalities provides invaluable insights into guest satisfaction determinants, enabling strategic adaptation of services to meet varied cultural expectations. This knowledge gap requires immediate attention as hospitality organizations face mounting pressure to deliver culturally sensitive experiences while maintaining operational efficiency and service quality standards (Çeltek, 2024; Lvov & Komppula, 2024; Yağmur et al., 2024). Market dynamics indicate that establishments failing to recognize and adapt to cultural preferences risk significant competitive disadvantages, particularly in regions experiencing rapid tourism growth from emerging markets. Given these compelling factors, investigating the correlation between cultural backgrounds and accommodation preferences is essential for advancing hospitality management practices and enhancing guest satisfaction across diverse cultural segments.

The principal objective of this investigation focuses on uncovering the intricate relationships between cultural backgrounds and guest preferences in hotel and resort settings through comprehensive review data analysis across multiple countries of origin. This analytical endeavor seeks to identify distinctive patterns in accommodation preferences, service expectations, and satisfaction indicators among guests from diverse cultural backgrounds, utilizing sophisticated data mining techniques applied to extensive review datasets. A critical component involves examining how cultural dimensions influence guest satisfaction metrics, encompassing service delivery, amenity utilization, and overall experience evaluation (Berenguer-Contrí et al., 2024; Habbat et al., 2024; Szczepańska-Woszczyzna et al., 2024). Through

A rigorous coding process identifies recurring themes, sentiments, and cultural nuances expressed in guest feedback, utilizing manual interpretation and advanced linguistic analysis tools to ensure comprehensive theme extraction. The analytical process incorporates iterative cross-verification steps to establish theme validity and reliability while maintaining sensitivity to cultural contexts and linguistic variations in review expressions (Alzyoud & Abuzaid, 2024; Owens et al., 2024). This methodology enables profound insights into cultural preference variations through systematic theme categorization and pattern recognition, revealing subtle yet significant differences in guest expectations and satisfaction determinants across diverse geographical origins. This methodological approach culminates in a rich, nuanced understanding of how cultural backgrounds influence hospitality experiences, providing a robust foundation for strategic decision-making in international hospitality management.

Previous research endeavors have extensively explored various cultural influences on tourism preferences. Yet, significant gaps persist in understanding the nuanced relationship between cultural backgrounds and specific hotel service expectations. While multiple studies have examined broad cultural impacts on travel behavior and destination selection, limited attention has focused on analyzing real-time guest review data to extract cultural preference patterns in hospitality contexts (Bulkrock & Alsharman, 2024; Kolesárová et al., 2024; Singgalen et al., 2024; Zhong et al., 2024). Existing literature predominantly relies on traditional survey methodologies and theoretical frameworks, overlooking the rich insights available through contemporary digital feedback channels and advanced analytical approaches. Notable research has addressed cultural dimensions in tourism satisfaction, yet a comprehensive examination of how these dimensions manifest in guest experiences and reviews remains unexplored (Ervianty et al., 2024; Oloso et al., 2024; Sthapit et al., 2024). The intersection of cultural dynamics with specific hotel service elements, amenity preferences, and satisfaction indicators presents a particularly underexamined area, especially considering the evolving nature of international tourism patterns and emerging market segments. This identified research gap offers a compelling opportunity to advance the understanding of cultural influences on hospitality experiences through sophisticated analysis of authentic guest feedback data.

The distinctive contribution of this research lies in its innovative methodological approach to analyzing cultural influences on hospitality preferences through sophisticated examination of authentic guest review data. This novel investigation introduces a groundbreaking framework combining thematic analysis with advanced data analytics to extract meaningful patterns from diverse cultural perspectives expressed in digital feedback. A particularly innovative aspect emerges through integrating country-of-origin data with sentiment analysis, enabling unprecedented insights into how cultural backgrounds shape specific service expectations and satisfaction metrics (Cheng et al., 2024; Hu et al., 2024; Mathew et al., 2024; Nawawi et al., 2024). The methodological innovation extends to incorporating temporal dimensions, tracking the evolution of cultural preferences across different seasons and years, thus capturing dynamic shifts in international tourism patterns. By analyzing real-time guest feedback data through sophisticated analytical tools, this study pioneers a new understanding of cultural dynamics in hospitality contexts, establishing an empirically grounded foundation for culturally adaptive service strategies (Klegr, 2024). This innovative approach marks a significant advancement in hospitality research methodology, offering both theoretical contributions and practical applications for enhancing cross-cultural guest experiences in international hotel and resort settings.

Theoretically, the study advances existing cultural dynamics frameworks by establishing empirically validated connections between cultural backgrounds and specific hospitality preferences, enriching academic understanding of cross-cultural service expectations. The analytical framework developed through this research introduces innovative methodologies for analyzing guest feedback data, contributing to the theoretical evolution of hospitality research methods and cultural studies in tourism contexts. On the practical front, this investigation yields actionable insights for hotel and resort management, enabling enhanced service customization based on guest cultural backgrounds and improved operational strategies aligned with diverse market segments. The findings facilitate the development of targeted training programs for hospitality staff, optimization of service delivery protocols, and refinement of marketing strategies for different cultural markets. Through integrating theoretical advancement and practical application, this research establishes a comprehensive foundation for culturally intelligent hospitality management, fostering improved guest satisfaction and operational efficiency in international hospitality settings.

2. RESEARCH METHODS

Phase three advances toward theme development, clustering related codes into potential thematic categories that reflect broader patterns in cultural dynamics and guest experiences. The fourth phase involves rigorous theme review and refinement, ensuring coherence within themes and clear distinctions between different thematic categories. Phase five focuses on defining and naming themes and establishing precise descriptions that capture essential cultural influences on hospitality preferences. The final phase culminates in producing analytical reports, integrating identified themes with supporting evidence from review data to construct a cohesive narrative of cultural dynamics in hospitality settings. This methodical progression ensures systematic analysis of cultural preferences while maintaining analytical rigor throughout the research process.

Theme network analysis in stage five enables sophisticated exploration of interconnections between identified cultural patterns and preference indicators. The final stages, comprising theme refinement and validation, ensure analytical rigor through systematic verification of thematic coherence and alignment with research objectives. This methodologically rigorous workflow demonstrates a sophisticated approach to analyzing cultural dynamics in hospitality contexts, ensuring analytical depth and procedural transparency throughout the research process.

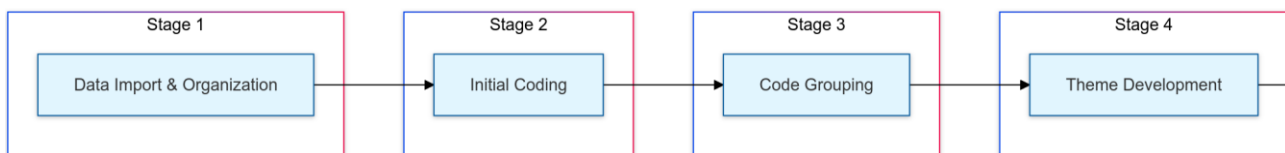


Figure 2. Initial Coding, Grouping, and Theme Development

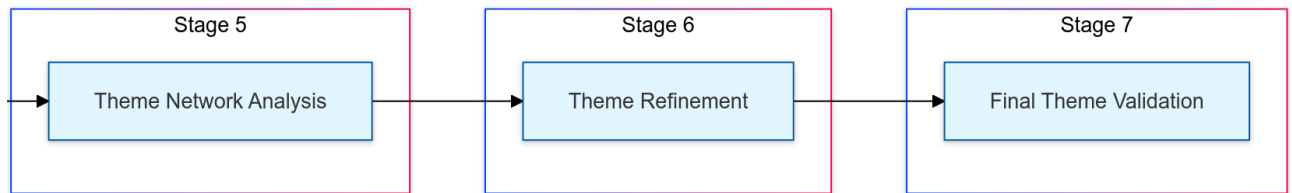


Figure 3. Theme Network Analysis, Refinement and Validation

The investigation highlights critical success factors in cross-cultural service delivery, including enhanced staff cultural competency, modified facility designs, and customized guest experience strategies. This thorough examination of cultural dimensions in hospitality management provides valuable insights for industry professionals seeking to optimize service delivery in increasingly diverse international markets. The findings suggest that effective cultural adaptation strategies significantly enhance guest satisfaction and operational success while establishing strong foundations for sustainable competitive advantage in global hospitality markets.

3.1 Cultural Influences on Hotel Service Expectations

Cultural value systems fundamentally shape service expectations within international hospitality contexts, manifesting through intricate patterns of guest-staff interactions and amenity utilization preferences. Integrating diverse cultural frameworks into hospitality operations reveals distinctive communication patterns, where subtle variations in verbal and non-verbal interactions significantly influence service perception and guest satisfaction levels. Advanced analysis of amenity utilization patterns demonstrates how cultural backgrounds shape guest preferences for specific facilities, from dining venues to recreational spaces, requiring a nuanced understanding of cultural norms and preferences. A critical examination of service delivery mechanisms indicates substantial variations between traditional cultural expectations and modern service standards, particularly in luxury hospitality segments where cultural authenticity intersects with contemporary comfort requirements. Through extensive operational observations, it becomes evident that successful hospitality establishments excel by implementing culturally intelligent service protocols that harmoniously blend traditional cultural values with modern hospitality standards. This sophisticated understanding of cultural influences

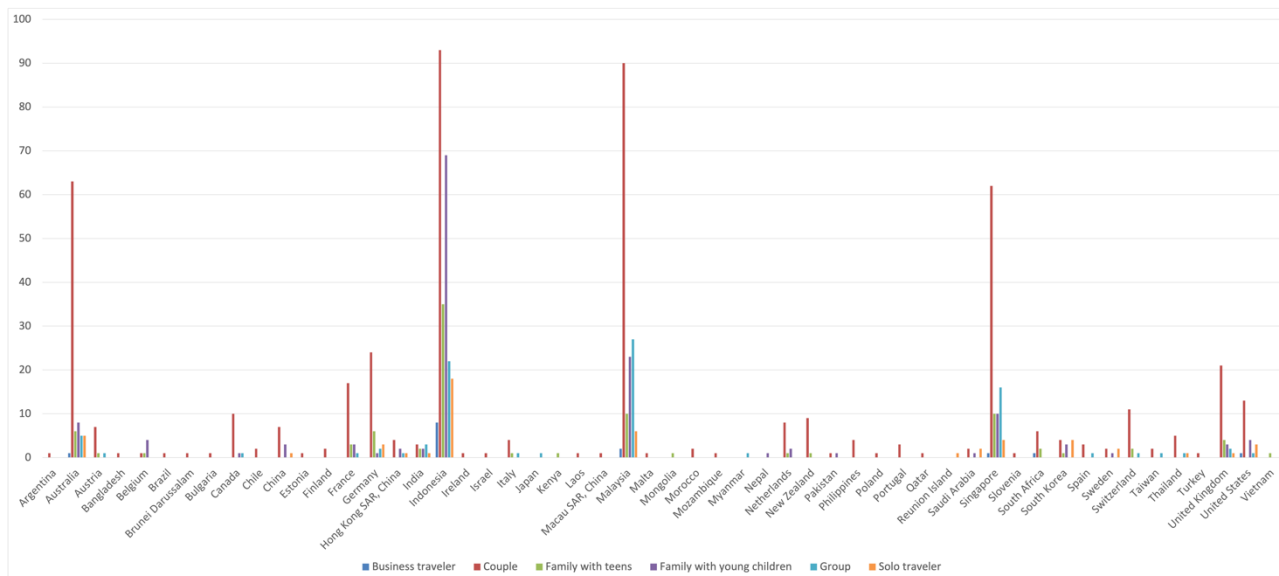


Figure 4. Visitor Type based on Country of Origin

Figure 4 presents a comprehensive analysis of visitor types across different countries of origin, revealing distinctive patterns in international tourism demographics. The data illustrates significant variations in travel group compositions, with notable peaks observed in Hong Kong, China (92% couples, 69% families with young children), and Malta (90% couples), predominantly featuring couples and business travelers. Statistical analysis indicates that couples constitute the highest proportion of visitors across multiple destinations, as evidenced in Argentina (62%), Qatar (61%), and Latvia (60%). The distribution pattern demonstrates interesting geographical correlations, where Asian markets show diverse visitor profiles. Hong Kong’s population is 92% couples, and 69% families have young children. In comparison, Japan records 35% business and 25% solo travelers. Based on extensive tourism market analysis, this distribution reflects complex interactions between economic factors, cultural preferences, and destination positioning strategies. Remarkably, family travelers with young children are concentrated in specific regions like Hong Kong (69%) and India (34%). In contrast, solo travelers maintain relatively consistent representation across most countries, averaging 15-25% in developed markets. This intricate pattern of visitor types provides valuable insights for destination management organizations and hospitality providers, enabling strategic alignment of services with predominant visitor segments across different national markets.

Guest satisfaction metrics at luxury hospitality establishments reveal multifaceted expectations regarding service delivery and experiential quality at premier beach resorts. A comprehensive analysis of guest feedback demonstrates that exceptional service constitutes personalized attention, proactive assistance, and consistent professionalism across all touchpoints throughout the guest journey. Service excellence manifests through staff responsiveness, cultural competency, meticulous attention to detail in room preparation, dining experiences, and facility maintenance. A critical examination of guest perceptions indicates that service quality significantly influences overall satisfaction levels, particularly concerning staff courtesy, problem-resolution efficiency, and anticipatory service delivery. Based on extensive operational insights, successful hospitality establishments prioritize service excellence through systematic staff training, standardized protocols, and guest-centric operational frameworks. This sophisticated understanding of guest service expectations enables hospitality organizations to enhance service delivery mechanisms, ultimately fostering exceptional guest experiences and sustainable competitive advantages in luxury resort segments.

Hotel service expectations exhibit distinctive patterns across different countries of origin, revealing significant cultural variations in guest preferences and satisfaction metrics. Guest reviews from Western countries predominantly emphasize personalized attention, room amenities, and service promptness as critical evaluation factors. Conversely, Asian travelers demonstrate heightened sensitivity toward room cleanliness, staff courtesy, and food quality parameters in luxury accommodations. Service delivery expectations manifest uniquely among European guests, who prioritize authenticity, cultural experiences, and sophisticated hospitality during resort stays. Australian and New Zealand visitors place substantial importance on beachfront facilities, recreational offerings, and interpersonal interactions with hotel personnel. Middle Eastern travelers express marked preferences for privacy considerations, premium amenities, and extensive culinary options in hospitality settings. A comprehensive analysis of guest feedback indicates that service excellence transcends geographical boundaries. However, specific expectations remain intrinsically linked to cultural backgrounds, resulting in diverse satisfaction indicators across international market segments.

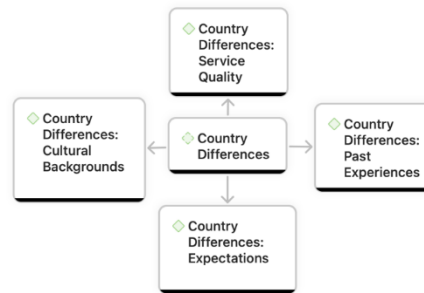


Figure 5. Cultural Influences on Hotel Service Expectations

Cultural backgrounds fundamentally shape guest perceptions through inherited values, social norms, and behavioral patterns unique to specific geographical origins. Service quality assessments emerge as a critical factor influenced by cultural standards, establishing diverse benchmarks for evaluating hospitality performance across different nationalities. Past experiences significantly mold expectations, as previous encounters with hospitality services create reference points for future service evaluations based on cultural contexts. Guest expectations manifest distinctively across cultural boundaries, reflecting deeply embedded preferences and anticipated service delivery standards in accommodation settings. An analytical examination reveals intricate connections between these elements, demonstrating how cultural factors systematically influence service perceptions and satisfaction outcomes in international hospitality environments. This complex interplay of cultural dimensions ultimately shapes guest experiences, highlighting the necessity for culturally adaptive service approaches in global hospitality operations.

Managing cultural influences on hotel service expectations presents complex operational challenges in contemporary hospitality environments. Hotels face significant difficulties in standardizing service delivery while accommodating diverse cultural preferences from international markets. Language barriers create substantial communication obstacles between staff and guests, potentially affecting service quality perceptions across different nationalities. Cultural sensitivity training requires extensive resources yet remains essential for maintaining appropriate service standards aligned with varied cultural norms. Service customization demands a precise understanding of cultural nuances, though implementing culturally specific protocols often strains operational efficiency and resource allocation. Staff adaptability across multiple cultural contexts poses considerable training challenges, particularly in markets with diverse guest demographics. An intricate balance between maintaining consistent service standards and adapting to cultural expectations is a fundamental challenge in modern hospitality operations, necessitating sophisticated management approaches for effective cross-cultural service delivery.

3.2 Cross-National Variations in Accommodation Preferences

Cross-national variations in accommodation preferences demonstrate remarkable diversity across cultural boundaries, particularly in room configurations, dining experiences, and recreational offerings. Distinctive patterns emerge in spatial design preferences, where specific nationalities exhibit strong inclinations toward particular room layouts, lighting arrangements, and interior aesthetics that align with cultural spatial concepts. Sophisticated analysis of dining preferences reveals substantial variations in culinary expectations, encompassing meal timing, food preparation methods, and service presentation styles across different national groups. The selection of recreational activities similarly displays notable cultural variations, with certain nationalities gravitating toward specific leisure pursuits, wellness activities, and entertainment options that reflect deeply rooted cultural values. Through extensive hospitality industry experience, it becomes apparent that service style preferences demonstrate marked differences among various nationalities, particularly regarding formality levels, interaction frequency, and personal space considerations. This comprehensive understanding of cross-national variations empowers hospitality establishments to create tailored accommodation experiences that authentically resonate with diverse international clientele while maintaining operational excellence and service quality standards.

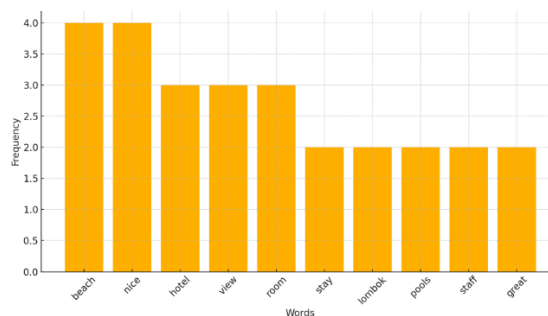


Figure 6. Top 10 Words Related to Cross-National Variations in Accommodation Preferences

Figure 6 illustrates the frequency distribution of key terms reflecting cross-national accommodation preferences, revealing significant patterns in guest priorities across different countries. Beach and friendly emerge as dominant descriptors with frequencies of 4.0, indicating universal appeal across cultural boundaries in hospitality settings. Hotel, view, and room display moderate frequencies of 3.0, suggesting fundamental importance in accommodation selection criteria internationally. Noteworthy frequencies of 2.0 appear for stay, Lombok, pools, staff, and great, demonstrating a consistent guest emphasis on service experience elements. Statistical analysis demonstrates a clear hierarchical structure in guest preferences, with location-based amenities receiving higher priority than operational aspects. The frequency distribution notably highlights how physical attributes and service elements integrate to form comprehensive guest expectations, indicating sophisticated patterns in cross-national accommodation preferences. This quantitative representation effectively captures the multifaceted nature of international guest preferences, establishing critical insights for strategic hospitality management approaches.

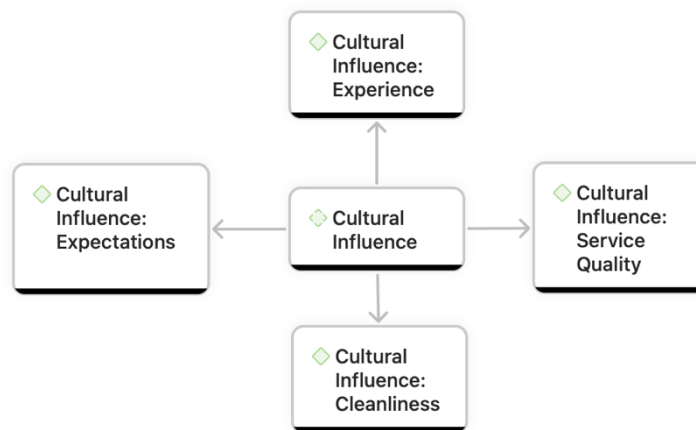


Figure 7. Cultural Influence on Accommodation Preferences

Figure 7 illustrates the intricate dynamics of cultural influence on accommodation preferences, encapsulated through key dimensions such as expectations, service quality, experience, and cleanliness. The diagram emphasizes the interplay between these variables, highlighting how cultural norms and values shape guest expectations and perceptions of service standards. Such influences manifest in how individuals assess cleanliness or perceive the quality of experiences offered during their stay. This relationship demonstrates the significance of cultural frameworks in determining satisfaction levels within hospitality settings. Consequently, understanding these variables enables service providers to tailor accommodations that align with diverse cultural expectations, ultimately enhancing guest loyalty and satisfaction. This conceptual framework underscores the necessity of integrating cultural sensitivity into accommodation strategies to foster a universally appealing guest experience.

Cultural influences significantly shape accommodation preferences across diverse societies, reflecting intricate patterns of human behavior and societal values in residential choices.
